

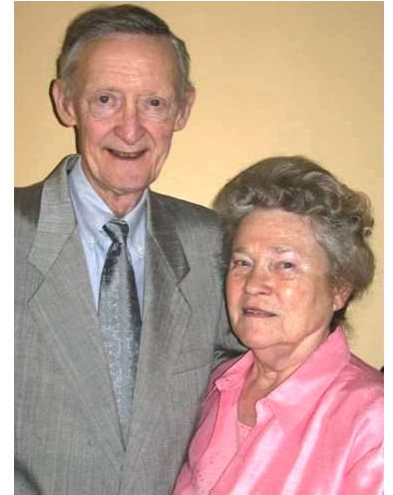

Overview of adjective astonished: amazed, astonished, astounded, **stunned**.

A totally unbelievable fact becomes astonishingly true to Saul of Tarsus. The totally unbelievably fact is ~ The God that he loved is the Jesus that he hated ~ JESUS IS GOD! Saul was trembling for his MISTAKE. He was STUNNED by his revelation.

Saul of Tarsus was not a criminal.

He was a devout Pharisee with a strong defense for what he believed. He loved God. The thing that blew him away was when he asked the question; "Who art thou Lord?" God answered and said: I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: Acts 9:5. Saul's encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus revealed to him that God became a man. It also reveals to all of us that God can Die the death of the body of a man and still be God. It reveals man can live again, as God intended, when He created him in the beginning. Saul went into Damascus and did what was told him he must do. Saul of Tarsus was first astonished, then, Born Again of the water and the Spirit.

Thomas had a similar experience trying to recognizing Jesus after His resurrection. John 20:27 Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing. 28 And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God. 29 Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

That Blessing is mine. I believe Jesus is God manifest in the flesh.
