For some time now I have been enjoying a revelation about Luke, the Gentile Gospel Writer. There are sixty six Books in the Bible. Sixty four books were written by Jews, Sons of Abraham, and God's chosen people. Two were written by a Gentile, the group on earth I belong to. This fascinates me. I keep being drawn back to it **because of its significance.**

Why is it so significant? Luke is writing to the Gentiles.

1. Luke, the Gentile, wrote his Gospel and the Book of Acts to the Gentile Theophilus.
2. Luke, the Gentile, begins his history of God's New Testament Church earlier than the other Gospel writers with the story of God breaking His 400 years of silence.
3. Luke, the Gentile, tells us things not in the other three Gospels. (All of the Gospels do this.)
4. Luke, the Gentile, records more clearly the reason for the Cross in Luke 24:45 Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures,
46 And said unto them, Thus it is written, and thus it behoved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day:
47 And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
5. In Acts 2:1-4 Luke, the Gentile, tells us all about the **beginning of the Church** Jesus died for. All we know about the actual Day of Pentecost Luke teaches us.
6. **Luke** wrote to the whole world what Jesus said **to do** in Acts 2:38. Peter spoke it~Luke wrote it.
7. **All churches** must go back to **Luke** to find their beginning.

Luke requires a thorough study.
